LOWDEN ROAD - SCHOOL STREETS SCHEME

AMENDMENT OF THE PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLE ZONE

[NOTE: This notice is about the amendment of the pedestrian and cycle zone in part of Lowden Road, which has been in force but will now be amended to allow for permit holders to access the pedestrian and cycle zone during the operational hours of the pedestrian and cycle zone indefinitely by the new order described below. The pedestrian and cycle zone will continue to operate between 8 am and 9 am and between 3 pm and 4 pm on Mondays to Fridays, in school term-time.]

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth proposes to make the Lambeth (Prescribed Routes) (No. -) Traffic Order 202- under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general effect of the Order would be to continue to ban motor vehicles from entering the length of Lowden Road that lies between Milkwood Road and Heron Road, during certain times of the day, however the Order is being amended to allow for permit holders access during the times of the motor vehicle ban. This would be achieved by continuing the pedestrian and cycle zone in that length of Lowden Road, and by continuing to place barriers at the junctions of Lowden Road with Milkwood Road and Heron Road (when necessary), between 8 am and 9 am and between 3 pm and 4 pm on Mondays to Fridays, during school term-time.
- 3. The amendment of the Order is necessary to continue to promote a pleasant environment that feels safer in the immediate vicinity of a school whilst seeking to minimise disruption to permit holders.
