Notice of Review of Polling Districts and Polling Places

Representation of the People Act 1983 (as amended)

Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England recently concluded its review of London Borough of Lambeth's electoral arrangements. The Commission has recommended that the number of wards in the borough increases from 21 to 25 wards.

In accordance with section 18C of the Representation of the People Act 1983 (as amended by section 17 of the Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013), Notice is hereby given that London Borough of Lambeth is conducting a review of its polling districts and polling places.

The (Acting) Returning Officer for the Parliamentary Constituencies of Dulwich & West Norwood, Streatham and Vauxhall will comment on existing polling stations and proposed new polling stations. These representations will be published on the Council's website and made available at Lambeth Town Hall and at Clapham, Streatham and West Norwood libraries from October 2021.

The Council has published its polling district and polling station scheme report today, **29 October 2021** and invites written representations by **no later than 30 November 2021**.

Details of the proposed scheme can be viewed at lambeth.gov.uk/vote. Documents are also available for public inspection at Clapham, Streatham, and West Norwood libraries and at Lambeth Town Hall, 2 Brixton Hill Rd, SW2 1RW by appointment.

All electors within London Borough of Lambeth and electors in London Borough of Southwark falling within Dulwich and West Norwood constituency may make representations.

The authority welcomes representations from any person or body with expertise in access for persons with any type of disability to comment on the authority's proposals, the (Acting) Returning Officer's representation or any other matters.

Representations should, if possible, give alternative places that may be used as polling places

All representations will be published on our web pages at the conclusion of the review and will be taken into account when deciding on the final scheme.

Following conclusion of the consultation period, a revised scheme will be drawn up for formal approval. New wards, polling districts and polling places will then come into force at the council elections in May 2022.
